

Born in Savona (Italy), Roberto Stuffo holds a Postgraduate Diploma (Level II) in Saxophone with honors and a Diploma in Clarinet from the Niccolò Paganini Conservatory in Genoa. He later earned a Degree in Saxophone from the Royal Academy of Music and the Guildhall School of Music & Drama, both in London (UK), as well as a degree in Saxophone Methodology and Pedagogy from the Swiss Music Institute (S.S.P.M.) in Bellinzona, Switzerland. Finally, he achieved the prestigious Doctorate in Saxophone from Trinity College, London (UK).

Since 2007, Roberto has worked as a Clarinet Professor at the “Nelson Mandela” Comprehensive Institute in Varazze (SV) and as a Clarinet and Saxophone Professor at the "Città di Cogoletto" Wind Band. Since 2008, he has collaborated with the Orchestra of the University of Eastern Piedmont and the saxophone quartet SaxUpo.
